Two caravans destroyed by fire at Bundaberg dealership after lithium-ion battery catches fire near mattress

Queensland authorities say a "failed" lithium-ion battery is the cause of a blaze that destroyed two caravans this week. The Queensland Fire Department (QFD) responded to Monday's blaze within minutes, but not before it spread to a neighbouring van as workers raced to move other caravans out of the way. The



fire, at a Bundaberg dealership about 400 kilometres north of Brisbane, was extinguished without damage to other property. A QFD spokesperson said investigations revealed a "failed lithium-ion battery next to a mattress" was the cause of the fire. It is unknown if the caravans were new or secondhand. The dealership declined to comment. The Caravan Industry Association of Australia (CIAA) said while batteries were often the electrical backbone of a van, they had only seen a "minor number" of battery incidents in caravans over the past few years. "There are issues from a [battery] industry perspective, this isn't necessarily specific or unique to caravanning," CIAA's communications manager Luke Chippendale said. An ABC report in March found that more than 1,000 fires had been caused by lithium-ion batteries in the past year, according to data from state and territory fire authorities. Safety reminder Meanwhile, authorities have urged caravan owners to stay informed about the industry's regulatory changes and safety precautions. Mr Chippendale said there were significant changes to the Australian Standard regarding the electrical supply in new caravans which took effect in November last year. "The new regulations stipulate that a lithium battery cannot be installed in habitable living areas, such as inside of the vans sleeping area, or the trailer itself," Mr Chippendale said. "Most of the installations now are occurring in a sealed-off area away from that, and it's vented to the exterior environment." From July 1, all caravans or motorhomes in Queensland will also be required to have photoelectric smoke alarms installed on the ceiling at the start, or transfer of the registration period. QFD's Mark Halverson said when caravanning regulations were followed, the risk of a fire was "very low", "When people go outside of those recommendations and do things that we would deem as quite silly, then the risk of fire increases quite dramatically," Supt Halverson said. Supt Halverson said it was important to always use a correct and undamaged charger and ideally charge a device outdoors. "Just because a charger fits into the charging port, doesn't mean it's the correct charger," he said. "Using an incorrect charger is very dangerous, and it's likely to result in a fire. "It should also be noted that charging the device should always be done in an outdoor area, if that's at all possible." He said the power supply to the charger should be disconnected, and the device reassessed, if there were any unusual signs including smells, noises or heat

Navigating a Breakdown in your RV: (Could apply to caravans as well)

Breaking down in an RV can be a challenging experience, but with a calm and methodical approach, you can manage the situation effectively. Whether you're on a cross-country road trip or exploring the great outdoors, being prepared, and knowing the right steps to take can make all the difference.

Prioritise Safety:

- As soon as you notice an issue, safely manoeuvre your RV to the side of the road.
- Activate hazard lights to alert other drivers to your presence.
- Enhance visibility with warning triangles, especially if you're on a busy road and wear a high visibility vest.

Assess the Situation:

- Identify the problem. Is it a flat tyre, engine trouble, or another issue?
- If it's within your capabilities, assess the problem; otherwise, focus on calling for assistance.

Call for Help:

- Reach out to your roadside assistance provider. If you don't have a plan, contact a local towing service or mechanic.
- Provide precise information about your location and the nature of the issue.

Stay In or Near Your RV:

- While awaiting assistance, if you remain inside the RV, you and your passengers need to wear seatbelts.
- If you have to get out of your vehicle:
- Always check for traffic
- Leave your vehicle from the passenger side (away from traffic)
- · Avoid crossing the road
- Stand clear of the road and move behind a safety barrier if it is safe to do so
- Wear a high visibility vest
- Use safety equipment like reflective triangles or cones if it's safe to set them up.

Stay Informed:

- Keep your mobile phone charged and maintain communication with the service provider.
- Be ready to offer additional details about your RV for a more efficient response.

Have Essential Supplies:

- Ensure you have water, snacks, and necessary medications for the wait especially when travelling in rural or remote areas.
- If the weather is cold, have warm clothing or blankets on hand.

Document the Situation:

- Capture images of the RV, surroundings, and any damage for insurance purposes.
- Keep a record of conversations with roadside assistance or towing services.

Consider Your Travel Plans:

- If the breakdown alters your schedule significantly, be prepared to adjust plans.
- Communicate with reservations or anyone expecting your arrival.

Experiencing a breakdown in your RV can be a roadblock, but with a systematic approach, you can navigate through the challenges. Prioritise safety, stay informed, and be prepared with essential supplies to make the waiting period more manageable. Remember, flexibility in your travel plans and effective communication can turn a potentially stressful situation into a manageable one.

Rod & I would like to thank everyone who attended as we had a great week doing very little and we hope to do it again next year. Fay and Rod


